If you look at the figures, you'll quickly see why Frankfurt Airport City ranks among the world's most important air traffic hubs:

History

- 1924: Founding of the company "Südwestdeutschen Luftverkehrs AG"
- 1936: The "Rhine-Main Airfield" begins operating
- 1949: System of parallel takeoff and landing runways finished
- 1954: Renamed "Flughafen Frankfurt/Main AG" (FAG)
- 1972: Terminal 1 and underground railway station open
- 1984: Takeoff runway 18 west begins operating
- 1994: Terminal 2 and the Sky Line elevated railway connecting it to Terminal 1 open
- 1997: - Start of operation of the FAG cargo handling facilities in CargoCity South
 - Inauguration of Pier D
 - Sky Line extended westward
- 1999: ICE train station begins operating
- 2000: Renamed Fraport AG
- 2001: Fraport AG takes its stock public
- 2002: Connection to the new ICE railway route to Cologne
- 2004: Rezoning decision to allow the A380 hangar in the southern part of the airport premises
- 2005: - First airport compatibility (handling) tests for the A380
 - U.S. Rhein-Main Air Base closes
- 2006: For the first time, FRA handles more than two-million metric tons of airfreight in a single year
- 2007: Construction of Airrail Center Frankfurt begins on the rooftop of the Long-distance Train Station

Business Data

With about 70,000 people working here, Frankfurt Airport is Germany's single largest place of

employment, ahead of Volkswagen in Wolfsburg.

Its stock, worth 914.8 million euros, is divided up as follows (as of March 2007):

- State of Hesse: 31.65%
- Stadtwerke Frankfurt am Main Holding GmbH: 20.21%
- Julius Bär Holding AG: 5.1%
- Deutsche Lufthansa AG: 9.98%
- The Capital Group Companies, Inc.: 5.07%
- Artisan Partners: 3.88%
- Free float: 24.11% (including employee-held shares)

The supervisory board has 20 members, 10 of which are appointed by the owners while the other ten represent the workforce.
